Writing: This term, we're diving into the world of descriptive writing, where pupils will bring their ideas to life with vivid imagery and creative use of figurative language. Following this, we'll delve into explanation writing, guiding pupils to uncover the reasons behind how and why things happen, turning their curiosity into clear and informative texts. We'll produce texts throughout the term based on our topics in Health & Wellbeing, Social Studies, and Science, while also enhancing our typing and computer literacy skills through digital technologies. Any extra practice with descriptive or explanation writing at home would be beneficial, but it's not an expectation!

Spelling: (led by Mrs. Mann)

Children will be given weekly word lists to master, with engaging activities to help them practice spelling patterns, as outlined in their spelling homework jotters. Spelling tests will be held every Friday, so be sure to check their jotters for all the details! Mark your calendars—Term 1's exciting rainbow spelling test is set for 13/09/24!

Reading: We'll have regular reading sessions in class, complemented by homework. Our class novel this term is the inspiring Wonder by R. J. Palacio. Please encourage your child to read their book each night to help spark a lifelong love of independent reading!

Comprehension: We will use our class book to enhance our comprehension skills while applying our VIPERS skills: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, and Retrieval, to analyse the text effectively. Grammar: Each child will work at their level on Jolly Grammar based competencies. Handwriting: (led by Mrs. Mann) Children will practice their handwriting to enhance presentation and develop a continuous cursive style.

Numeracy & Maths

French/ Spanish

Every morning, we practice our numbers, days of the week. months of the year. weather and time in French and Spanish. French: We'll embark on an exciting journey recapping French numbers from 0-100 through a variety of fun activities! Spanish: We'll focus on Spanish numbers from 0-31 with many engaging activities!

Expressive Arts

Art: (led by Mrs. Copeland) This term, we'll concentrate on pencil and ink drawings, emphasising adding intricate details to our artwork. We'll connect our creations to our topics of study while embracing pupil choice! Drama & Music: We will be studying the song 'Classroom Jazz!' PE: We will focus on improving our fitness levels and developing our racquet skills

Science
