## Litter and Waste

Creating litter and dog fouling posters with our visitor.

1. The children discussed the issue of dog fouling outside our school grounds. They are keen to take action. Our local Community Safety Officer, Andrew Hay will be visiting our school in term 2 to work with all pupils on the issues of litter and dog fouling. The Eco Committee could report that both classes have been creating dog fouling posters in P1-4 and P5-7. Our Community Safety Officer will help mount these onto weatherproof board along with the authority logo to encourage responsible dog ownership. Our Parent Council were also concerned about this issue. Ms. Whorlow arranged for the Community Safety Team to put up official signs along our railing.

# 2. Little picking rota-
