Starting with Litter & Waste, I really liked how proactive you've been with your regular litter picks. It was great to see that these aren't just limited to the school grounds—you've taken your actions into the wider community and even the beach! The way you've involved your Eco Committee and set up a proper rota shows great organisation, and the partnership with community safety wardens adds another brilliant layer of learning. I especially enjoyed reading about your contributions to campaigns like the Great British Beach Clean—it's fantastic to see your pupils taking part in such important national efforts. I also thought your rag bag collections and uniform swap shop were brilliant practical solutions. They're not only eco-friendly, but also supportive for families. The fact that you've found so many ways to encourage reusing and recycling in school is great.

When I looked at your Climate Action work, I was really inspired by how many creative and meaningful activities you've included. From encouraging reusable water bottles to hosting swap shops for Halloween costumes, you've thought about both environmental impact and inclusion. It's great that you had participation in Earth Hour and Walk to School Week, and the fact that you included lessons on food miles, sustainable diets, and renewable energy made it all the more powerful. The Glasgow Science Centre Roadshow and TechSheCan webinars were great way to engage pupils in climate education through fun and accessible learning. Well done.

There's so much going on in your School Grounds topic.
