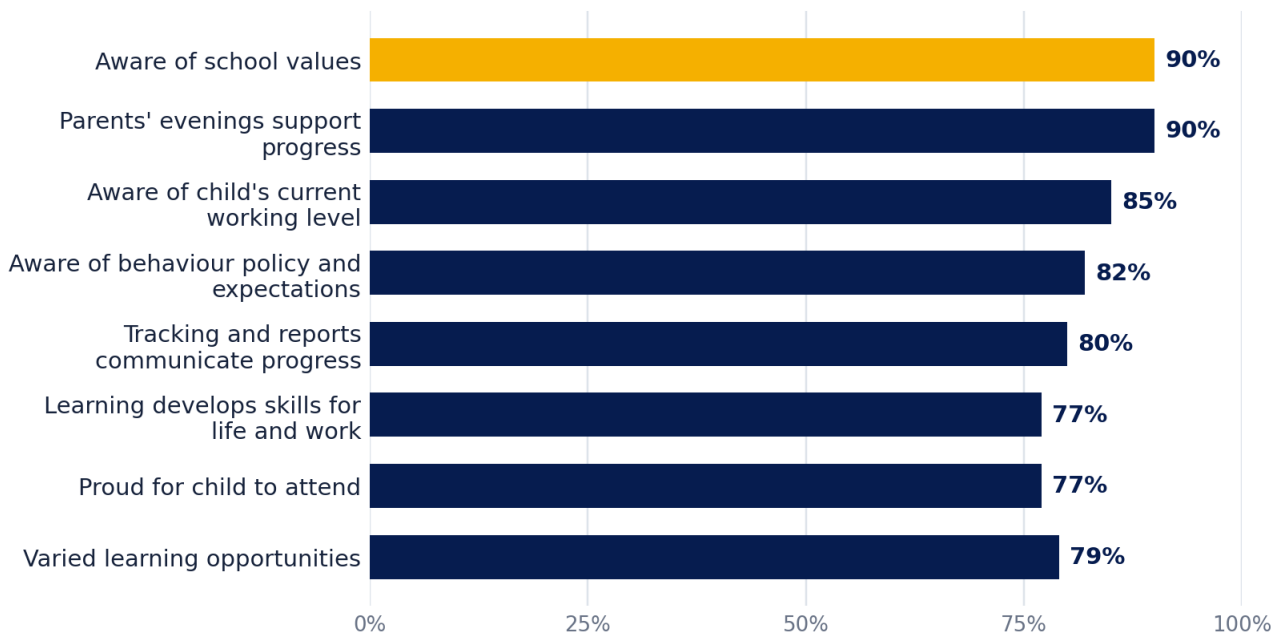
71 responses from parents and carers across S2-S6

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Where responses were strongest



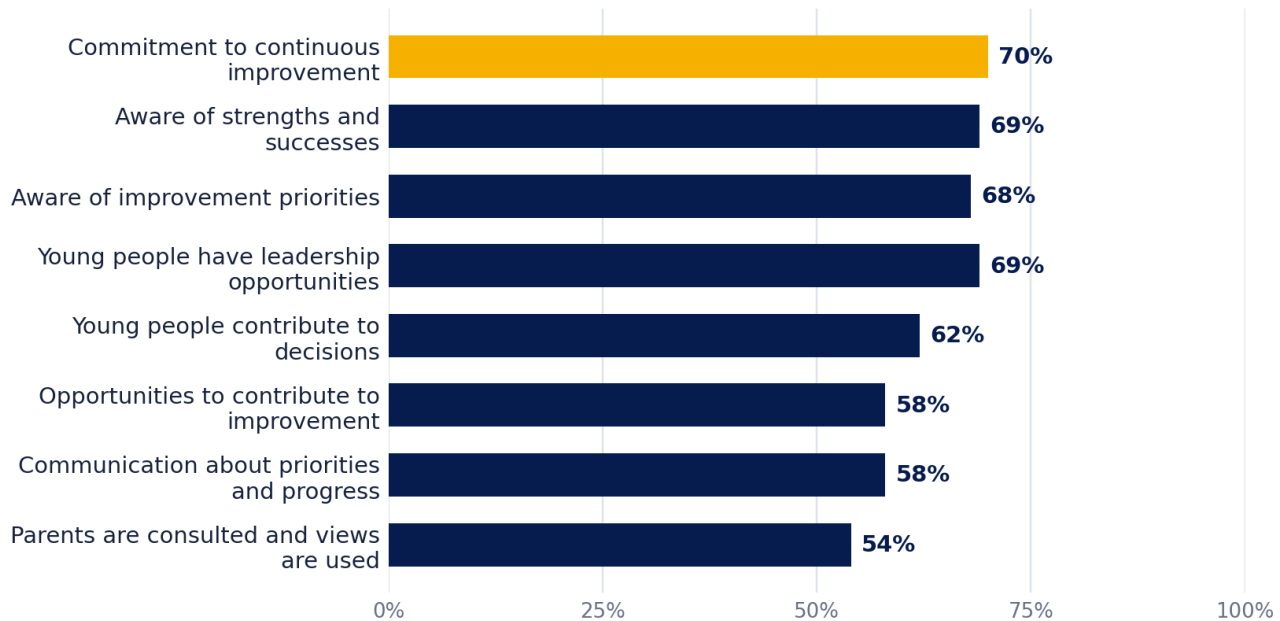
Parents and carers were particularly positive about awareness of the school values, parents' evenings, tracking and reporting, and the range of learning opportunities.

Aware of the Positive Behaviour Policy and expectations	Most (82%)
Confident behavioural issues are addressed appropriately and fairly	The majority (65%)
Believe positive behaviour is promoted and recognised effectively	The majority (69%)
Believe the school encourages young people to 'Be Kind'	Most (75%)
Believe curriculum choices and pathways meet needs and aspirations	The majority (68%)
Believe learning develops skills for learning, life and work	Most (77%)
Believe the curriculum prepares young people for their next stage	The majority (66%)

Options process: 38 parents/carers said they used the opportunity to discuss choices with Pupil Support. Of the 38 who answered the follow-up question, 37 - almost all (97%) - said the support helped to a great or some extent.

What happens next

Communicate improvement clearly	Provide concise, regular updates on priorities, progress and the impact of improvement work.
Increase meaningful consultation	Create more planned opportunities for parents and carers to contribute and explain how feedback has been used.
Evaluate and report impact	Use future surveys and other evidence to measure improvement from the 2025/26 baselines and report back annually.
