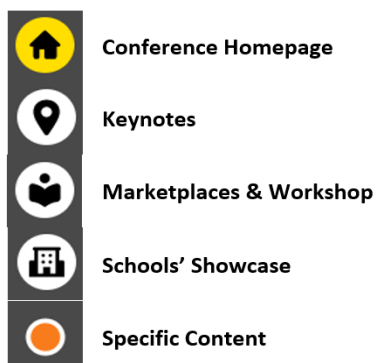
Schools' Showcase
