- Support collaboration across sectors, within settings and with partners.

Resulting in confidence in using Scotland's Curriculum Framework to:

- Develop a curriculum which is relevant for every learner in the context in which they live and learn
- Build on the strengths of communities and partners
- Identify appropriate approaches to evidence impact of their curriculum change
- Enable learning agency and engagement in their learner journeys

Each session will include time for 'knowledge exchange' around your curriculum, so please come prepared to share your learning journey. We will also have exemplifications and tools for you to utilise personally/within context to support your curriculum design journey

1. Scotland's Curriculum: Where are we now? Where are we going? What matters? (IN-PERSON, Spirit Aerosystems Innovation Centre, Prestwick) Wed 27th Sept, 10am – 4pm

This session will allow us to explore curriculum-making in the context of educational reform and consider the purposes and practices of curriculum design. We will also share and consider our individual and shared successes and goals around curriculum design.

2. Leading Curriculum Innovation (on TEAMS) Thurs 12th Oct, 9:30am – 12:30pm

Leaders from 3-18 settings will share how they have led their school communities to place learner agency at the heart of curriculum innovation. (With a focus on the HOW, rather than the WHAT)

After we will have time for questions and discussion. Also, start to think about your own setting and context and where your attention could focus.

3. Taking a closer look at child-centred pedagogy (on TEAMS) Thurs 16th Nov, 10am – 12:30pm

This session will explore, consider, and exemplify key messages and learning across the 3-18 curriculum. How can we learn from the journey across 3 to 18? – Outdoor learning, IDL etc

4. Curriculum Making (on TEAMS) Wed 6th Dec, 9:30 – 12:30pm This content will be explored in session one and co-created.

5. Taking a closer look at Curriculum Thematics (on TEAMS) Tues 23rd Jan, 10am – 12:30pm A chance to hear from HMIe (tbc) and leaders who have experienced thematic reviews

6. Bringing it all together – What and So What? (IN PERSON) VENUE TBC Friday 8th March 10am – 4pm

This session will explore learning across the 5 sessions and each participant will get the opportunity to share ideas for curriculum innovation next session, identify opportunities for collaboration and discuss the kind of support we want and can offer each other going forward.
