
Would you like your pupils to learn about Data Handling using real data? Would you like to increase your pupils'

South West Scotland has some of the highest rates of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in the world.

COPD is a progressive lung condition that is the world's third biggest killer disease.

Scotland and Ireland (North and South) together share this common health burden.

Better diagnosis, treatment and management would improve the health and quality of life of patients with COPD.

A new research training network has been created called the **Border and Regions Airways Training Hub (BREATH)**. This team of scientists from Dundalk Institute of Technology, Queen's University Belfast and University of the West of Scotland, want to share their skills to train the best young scientists to help in the work to find new and better treatments for COPD. BREATH experts can work with you to raise awareness about COPD, by:

- Educating young people about cutting-edge research relevant to their lung health & wellbeing
- Involving students in a 'Citizen Science' project, monitoring air quality around their school
- Inviting students to join their scientists on a 'research journey' through visits, online and social media
- Contributing current scientific insight into ongoing school anti-smoking messages
