At 08:20, Tom was treated to an RAF flypast featuring a Spitfire and Hurricane from the RAF Battle of Britain Memorial Flight.

On top of this, he has also received birthday wishes from a range of famous people, including Queen Elizabeth II and the Prime Minister – Boris Johnson. In his video message to Captain Tom, he stated: “Your heroic efforts have lifted the spirits of the entire nation; you’ve created a channel to enable millions to say a heartfelt thank you to the remarkable men and women in our NHS who have all been doing the most outstanding job.”

As if that wasn’t enough, Tom has also broken a World Record this week! When his single, ‘You’ll Never Walk Alone’, which he sang alongside Michael Ball and members of the NHS, took the top spot last weekend, he became the oldest person to ever achieve a number one!
