# Purple Pinkie Assembly and Planting

On Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October we hope to welcome some members of the Rotary to speak to the children at Assembly about their new charity campaign; Rotary International's worldwide campaign to eradicate polio once and for all. This will begin with raising awareness of the disease among our pupils, and then with yourselves the parents, and hopefully raise much needed funds to help complete the immunization process and ultimate eradication of the disease. When children are vaccinated against polio, they have a purple stamp put on one of their little fingers. In this way the immunization team knows who has been vaccinated. Therefore on Purple Pinkie day the pupils are asked to

provide a donation of 50p to pay for a single immunization – and get a purple pinkie as well as a purple crocus bulb to plant in the school grounds to focus others attention towards the campaign. Planting will take place on the 28<sup>th</sup> October in the afternoon with everyone being encouraged to bring a 50p donation and to plant a crocus bulb to signify their contribution to the fund raising effort.

#### <u>Once a week — take a peek!</u>

Unfortunately the minute we return to school we also seem to have unwelcomed visitors in school — head lice! Approximately one in 10 UK school children have head lice at any one time and contrary to popular belief, they are easier to treat nowadays. The best advice we can offer parents to help us all tackle the problem is in line with one of the campaigns and website appropriately named – Once a week take a peek! Checking your child's hair regularly should be part of your family's personal hygiene routine and could stop a small problem becoming a persistent issue. There are many ways to go about treating head lice should you discover the problem but we need to act fast and check frequently first. The website www.onceaweektakeapeek.co.uk offers free advice to parents, we annually discuss the health and hygiene issue with the pupils in school and we hope to send out advice leaflets to help educate the whole family in the near future as well.
