Improvement Plan

The teaching staff have also evaluated progress and changes made this school session in line with the current School Improvement Plan and some of the targets will be continued and developed in the new session (Big Writing, GLOW, Spelling etc.). Together we have also set the school, new targets for improvement.

These new targets include;

- Developing Restorative Approaches to behaviour; including peer mentoring and mediation, 1,2,3, Magic and Massage in Schools.
- Teacher Learning Communities will set professional improvement targets for classes in Art.
- Drugs and Substance Misuse; incorporated within an Interdisciplinary theme for an extended transition topic.
- Numeracy; setting baseline assessments and target setting.
- Reading; target setting and assessment.
- Moderation

Primary 4 and 3/4 sang at Christmas time to entertain shoppers in Morrisons and funds raised went to Hansel. The spring term saw an excellent and enterprise Spring Fayre through the combined efforts of the pupils and Parent Council this raised enough money to buy planting troughs for Pr.Is vegetables, strawberry plants and planters for Pr.3/4 and playground paint for the games recently designed and added to the playgrounds. We have also raised funds through the Jammy Jog to Japan in respect of the TESCO great run for the Marys Meals charity which is also our ethical incentive scheme run in conjunction with Onsite |Services in the dinner hall where every meal bought raises points which are traded for goods to send to the same charity.
