## 12 September 2023 - on Teams

#### 1. Welcome

CD welcomed everyone to the meeting.

#### 3. Minutes of Last Meeting

The minutes were approved by general consensus.

#### 4. Correspondence

#### Matters raised by parents:

Many parents had raised with the PC that they are disappointed that Lochnorris children do not get summer trips like most other schools and that parents are not invited to the year end celebration of success in the same way as other schools.

CO'D advised that it was her policy that trips should only be of an educational nature, that buses were expensive, and staff were not obliged to take children on trips. Members noted that other schools are able to overcome these issues. CO'D noted that options around the celebration of success event were being considered, but that Barony Hall would not accommodate the full school plus parents in one sitting. Members asked that eternal venues be considered too eg local churches. Discussion took place around the context of the event and celebrating achievements of all kinds – sporting, extra curricular, values etc. J D'Agostino noted that the event in June had been very nice. General observation that the only full school community events are the Christmas nativity and concert.

LS is working on a parental engagement calendar to improve links between the school and families.

The most significant gaps between quintile 1 and quintile 5 are at P1. Unclear why. There are 16 pupils in Q1 in P1. Question from member around early intervention at early years – CO'D noted that a better transfer of information is required from ECCs. There was excellent feedback on the P1 play based pedagogy during he learning visit.





The overall aim is to close the gap and raise the bar. Each level is a challenge for all and it is rare to achieve higher than the level. JT noted that discussions are ongoing with RBA maths staff in order to challenge the high achievers in P7.

#### 6. Finalised School Improvement Plan and PEF Budget

**Numeracy** – focus will be on "back to basics" including mental maths, applying skills in context and holistic assessment. (JT)

**Literacy** – auditing current practice in teaching reading, looking at uptake of bug club but have also purchased physical books, reviewing policy, new P1 writing program. Two staff on EAC working grup for listening and talking scheme. (LS)

**Employability/skills/DYW** - Will repeat world of work week, using Harmony project for curriculum redevelopment and looking at learning through enquiry.

**Health and Wellbeing** - Using the Glasgow Motivation and Wellbeing Profile and training to provide supports such as Lets Introduce Anxiety Management (LIAM) and Nurture approaches.

#### Rights Respecting schools

#### Relationships framework

CO'D noted that **attendance** was poor – to quantify for next meeting. School to be more proactive on targeting poor attendance. Including improving parental engagement to value education.

To work on delivering 2 hours of PE per week for every child.

#### PEF and targeting the poverty related attainment gap

- LIAM
- Parental involvement program (survey to be issued)
- Extra teacher for team teaching
- Extra management time
- 3 classroom assistants
- Breakfast Club (although not that well attended)

## 7. Head Teacher Update

- 493 on school roll
- 18 classes
- 13% of children on ASN log





- 25% of children in Quintile 1 of SIMD (16% on ASN log)
- 14 new non-P1 pupils in August
- 68 new P1s

Need to target AND children and Quintile 1 children

Lots of dysregulation amongst children on return to school after the summer, although now most children are settled.

David Campbell of NEST (neurodevelopmental team) held parental workshops before the summer as well as sessions with staff.

Open afternoons are planned for numeracy and literacy.

Members thanked staff for the schedule of important dates.

The P7 residential is in the diary – no information has been provided to parents as yet as looking at alternatives.
