What is Child Protection about?

All of the adults around you think that your health, safety and welfare are very important. In our school, we respect our children and help to protect their rights. We do our best to help children make good educational progress. We teach children how to recognise risks in different situations, and how to protect themselves and stay safe.



How will we try to protect children?

We try to provide a safe environment for children to learn in; We want to help to ensure that children remain safe, at home as well as at school; We think it is important for our children to know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.

Don't keep it a secret if:

- Someone is bullying you – swearing at you saying hurtful words;
- Saying funny things to you that you do not like or upsets you;
- Touching you in places you know are wrong;
- Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol;
- Hitting you or hurting you;
- Sending unkind messages on the internet or to your phone.



If you need to talk – we will listen!

You can talk to any adult in school - your teacher, classroom assistant or anyone that helps in school if you need to. It is Mrs Greig and Mrs McLurkin's special job to keep you safe – talk to them if you are worried. You can talk to parents/adults at home.
