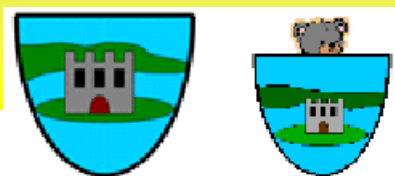

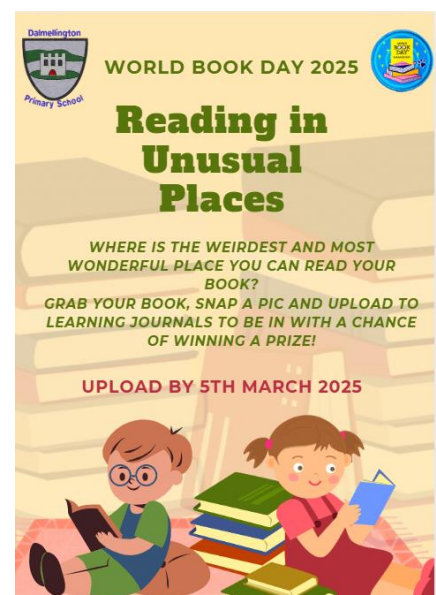
## World Book Day Toast and Tales

We will participate in Red Nose Day by dressing in something red and taking part in our joke competition. We will not be collecting donations on the day, but leave it to families to make their own donations.

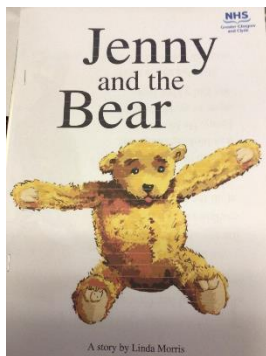


### ECC Update

### Primary 4/3 update



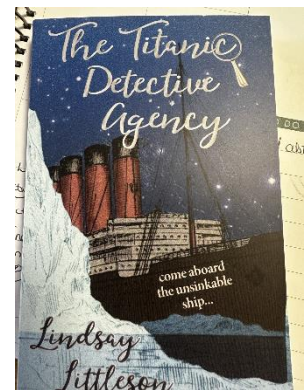
