


We were successful! Thank you to everyone who voted.



<u>School Refurbishment</u>

We will be having some refurbishment work carried out in the school. This will be done in several phases, the first of which will be during the summer holidays in 2022.

The lower primary classes and the small hall will be in the first phase which will happen in the summer of 2022. R1, R2, R3, R4, R5 & R6 will be in this first phase.

Walls will be painted white with the lower half of walls fitted with a wipe able white plastic wall covering. New vinyl throughout, new white roller blinds throughout and radiators painted.
