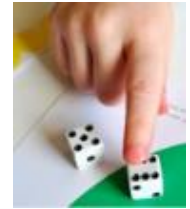

-  Washing machine

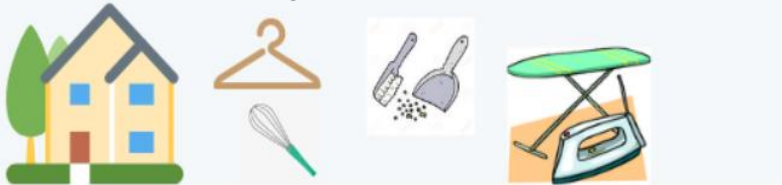


## Word Detective

## "I went to the supermarket..."



Take turns with your child to say...  
"I went to the supermarket and I bought **apples**."






*Your child's turn:*

"I went to the supermarket and I bought **apples** and **bananas**."

Keep going. Try to remember all the items.



## Do as I say...

1. Give your child an instruction e.g. clap your hands,  or stand up,  or wave bye .
2. Say one of the instructions but do something else e.g. say clap your hands  but stand up instead. .

**Your child has to do what you SAY, not what you do.**





## Kim's Game



Put some objects on a table.  
Can your child name them?  
Ask your child to close their eyes.  
Take one of the objects away.  
Open eyes.  
Can your child say which object is missing?



## Kim's Game



### Make it harder

- Take 2 objects away - does your child know which ones you hid?
- Use objects that your child doesn't know so well - take 1 away - do they know what one it was?
