Week 1

<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Letter formation</u> - Practise making patterns and the letters you know in sand, rice, shaving foam, paper or use a stick to practise in the mud. Can you write your first and last name?</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Counting objects</u> - find things around the house to count out loud. How many cushions? How many lights? How many cups? How many shoes? How many chairs? How many toys?</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p>1:1 Correspondence - Play a game of snakes and ladders using the board below.</p> 
<p>STEM</p> <p><u>Floating and Sinking</u> - ask an adult to help you fill a basin or bowl with water. Find items around the house and test to see if they float or sink. Make a guess first before you try. This is called an estimate. Were there any surprises?</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Reading</u> - Choose a favourite story. First, ask a grown-up to read it to you. Next, you re-tell the story in your own words. Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and talk about why you liked that part. Can you think of a different ending to the story?</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Rhyming Words</u> -which words rhyme with - cat, net, tin, fan, cup, rot, bag, lick, tea, may? Can you say this nursery rhyme? Hey Diddle Diddle The Cat and the fiddle The cow jumped over the moon The little dog laughed to see such fun And the dish ran away with the spoon. Which words rhyme?</p>
<p>Social Studies</p> <p><u>People Who Help Us</u> - Make a thank you card for your teacher who will be missing you while you are at home. Think about what they might like to see on the card. Can you write your first and last name on it?</p>	<p>Expressive Arts</p> <p>Make a painting using potato printing! You can keep it simple or you can ask an adult to help carve designs into the potatoes. What kind of pictures can you make?</p> 	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Spotting Numbers</u> – Have a look inside and outside and see how many numbers you can spot. How many numbers you can say? Week 2

<p>Literacy</p> <p>Using your spelling words 'at', 'the' and 'it.' Use a newspaper or magazine and hunt for the letters which make the words, cut them out and stick them on some paper. Alternatively you can write the words 3 times.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">at the it</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>Cosmic Yoga</u> - This is a big favourite in Dunlop Primary. Follow the link to a yoga session based on <i>We are Going on a Bear Hunt</i>.</p> 	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Teddy Bear Numbers</u> - Follow the link and play the game selecting numbers up to 10.</p> <p>Teddy Bear Numbers</p>
<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Problem Solving</u> How many ways can you make 10?</p> 	<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Reading for Pleasure</u> - Pick a favourite book to read with an adult. Can you use the pictures to work out what is happening before you start reading? When you finish, draw a new cover for the book.</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p><u>Friendship</u> - Nemo had lots of friends who looked out for him. Draw a picture of all of your friends. Tell an adult about your favourite things to do with your friends.</p> 
<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Phonics</u> Go on a sound hunt around your house! Can you find different things that start with the letters you know?</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p><u>Phonics Pop</u> - Follow the link and play Balloon Phonics - initial sounds. Once you have played, can you find things around the house which begin with the sounds you know?</p> <p>Phonics Pop</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p><u>Counting</u> - Play a game of beat that! Roll 2 dice (or more for an extra challenge) and count how many dots you have in total. Taking turns with an adult, see who can get the highest number of dots.</p>
