Well done to the group of Senior Modern Studies pupils who met Jack McConnell last week and delivered a presentation about their time in Belfast.



Pupils in this group have quite a bit of power to influence the Grange culture so join up and make your voice heard!




Film Club

You can work on your own projects, catch up on homework or work on fun group activities such as fashion design, sculpture, jewellery making...the list is endless!


If you are in S1 and attending Art Club you must bring written consent from your parent/guardian stating that you will be picked up from school or allowed to make your own way home.

Active Girls Day is on Wednesday 3rd October.


All S1 -S3 girls will take part.

Girls can wear PE kit to school on this day.






