You'll see them in The Street and in corridors at interval and lunch every day.


Remember that \$1-3 pupils should be in The Street, outside, or attending a club at these times – not in stairwells and corridors.

INTERHOUSE UPDATE


Well done to all the girls who took part in Active Girls day earlier this month. Every girl who took part won a point for their house!


