It would be dead nice if all of us could communicate (even a wee bit) with folk who use British Sign Language so here's three for starters...




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Move your fingers from your chin towards the person to say "thank you"



Ok, there was bound to be some mention of Maths in a bulletin put together by Mr Smith...here it is!


