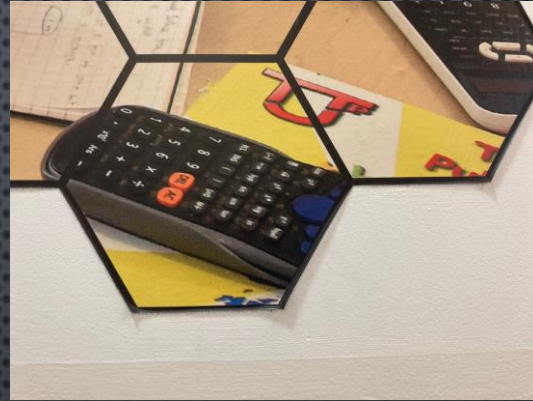

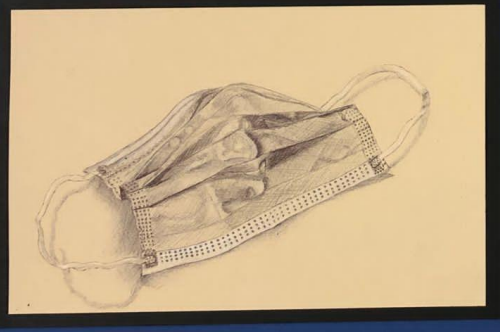

You should reflect on and critically evaluate the creative process you followed when working through your expressive portfolio. In your evaluation give justified personal opinions on:

- the decisions you made when working through your portfolio
- the achievement of the final quality of your portfolio, referring to your theme/subject.

To create my expressive portfolio, I started with my theme of Covid-19. The reason I chose this theme is because for the last 2 years it has been something that has affected many around the world, including myself, so creating it as my theme was very meaningful to me. To begin with, I chose the object that represents Covid-19 the most, which is a mask. I initially experimented with using one, but the more I used, I realised my skills in cross-hatching and tonality. So, I got with a material that I found easy to work with such as cardboard. To use for my first prototype... My next object was a simple bottle of soap, which I decided to go out of my comfort zone and use. I started in coloured pencil, which gave me a good base, and then I used acrylic paint to add more detail. I really enjoyed the outcome and was pleased, however, with my first prototype... Knowing the material I had, I decided to go out of my comfort zone and use acrylic paint to express my emotions on Covid-19 and the seriousness of the theme. Producing all these as my prototypes was very hard, but I was comfortable with my theme, objects and material. Encouraging a variety of objects and switching materials helped me to develop my drawing, painting and other concepts from different viewpoints. With the use of acrylic paint in all these prototypes, I got the chance to work in acrylic and use pieces of paper, which I stuck with acrylic paint and mixed out of my objects together, which really expressed the importance of my theme and conveyed my skills in tonality, colour, atmosphere and composition. Overall, my theme of Covid-19 was conveyed through acrylic paint, the exact way I wanted.

Also, well done to the classmates he had around him supporting him throughout- there were lots of cheers at the end for him.



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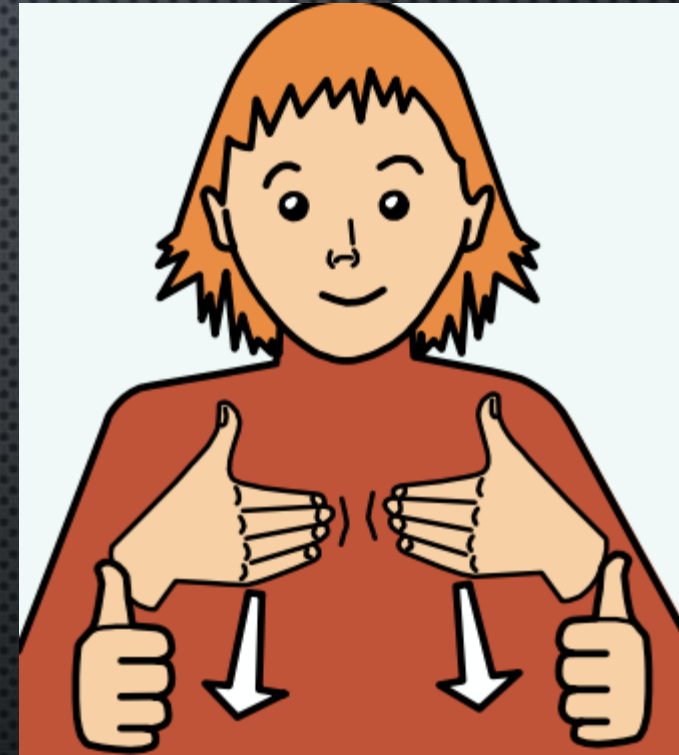
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Sign of the Week : “Be Kind”

Mrs Wilson's Maths class finished in the top 10 for "Maths wi nae Borders" during Maths Week Scotland.

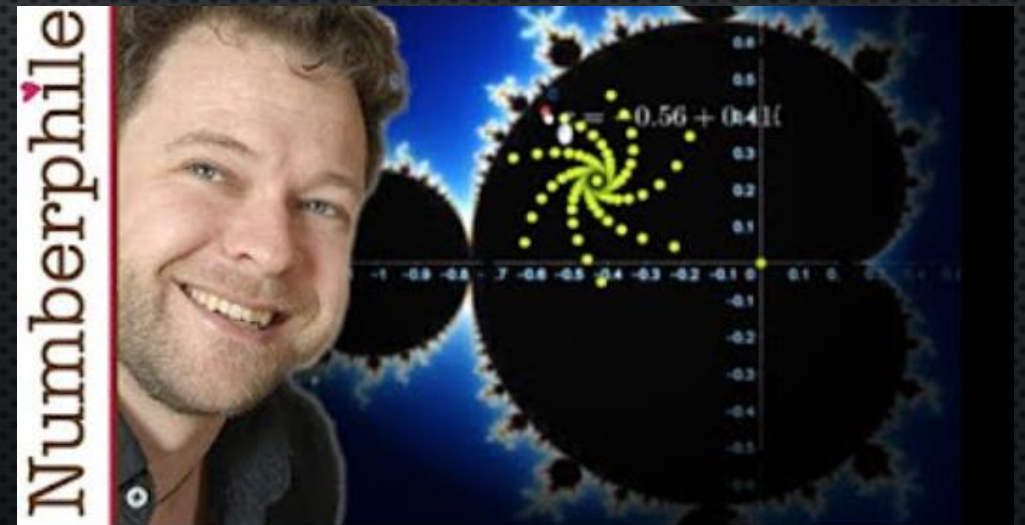
They had a wee treat recently- a virtual workshop from Mathemagicians Katie Steckles and Ben Sparks!
