



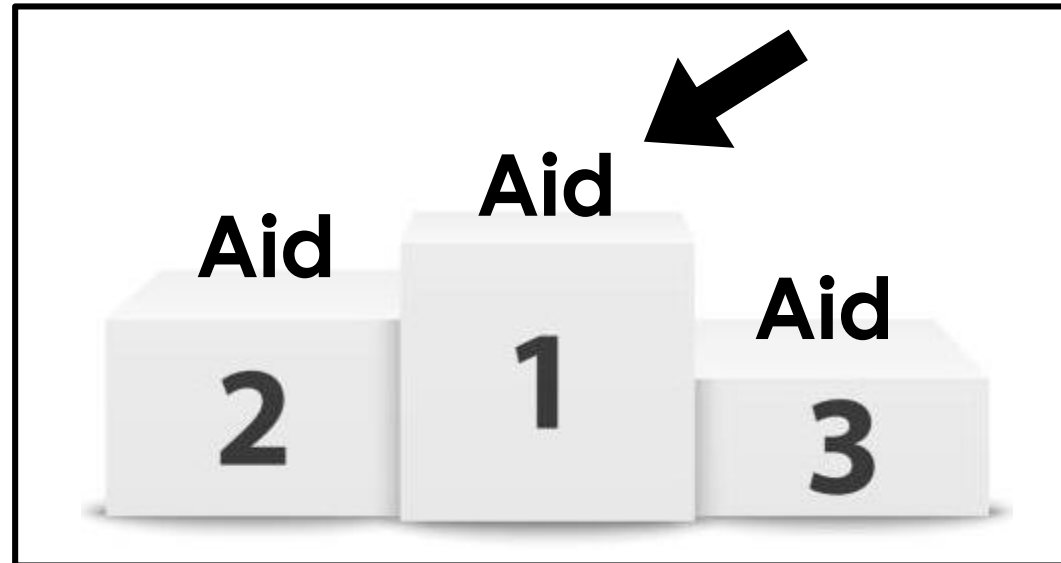

# One-way System: Consultation

As a school, we want to make sure movement between classes is **safe** and that our one-way system is **clear**.

Pupil feedback tells us that, at the moment, there are a lot of crushes in the corridors and it isn't always clear how to get from one subject to the other.

A one-way system is the best way for us to keep everyone in the school safe. We understand that the routes from one class to another can feel long, but sometimes taking the most direct route to your next class can slow down other pupils and have a knock-on effect across the whole school.

Look over the next slides which explain the current one-way system, then think about any constructive feedback you can give us.

# One-way System: Main Points

- After classes, pupils should follow the one-way system back to the Ground Floor and head to their next subject.
- Only PE and Drama pupils can access The Street between periods 4 and 5.
- The Maths stairwell is the only pupil access to the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor.
- The Art stairwell is the only pupil access to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor.
- The back stairwells can only be used to access the Ground Floor.
- At the **start of the day**, both of the main stairwells can be used to access the 1st Floor and the 2nd Floor.
- At **lunchtime** and the **end of the day**, all stairwells can be used to access the ground floor.



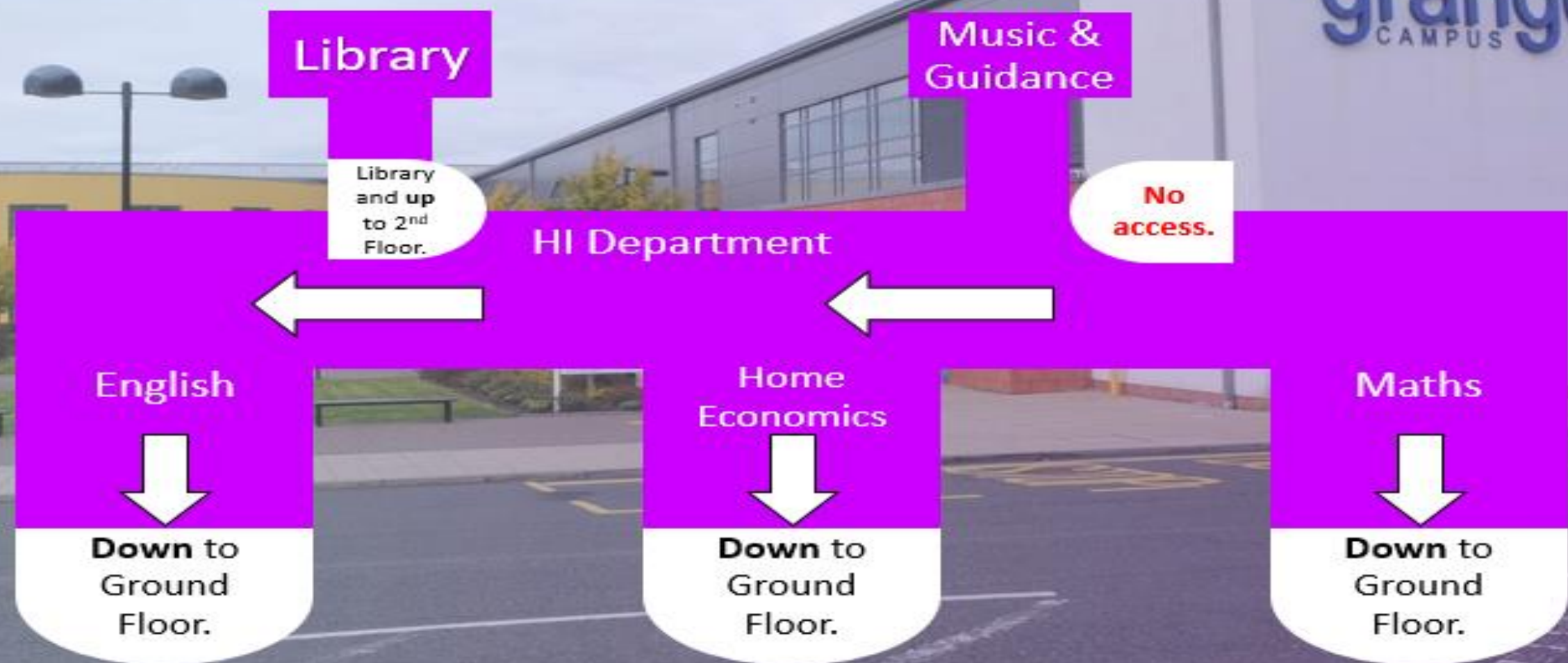
# Ground Floor

- Only PE and Drama pupils can access The Street between periods 4 and 5.
- The signs in The Street identify the doors and stairwells to use for each subject area.



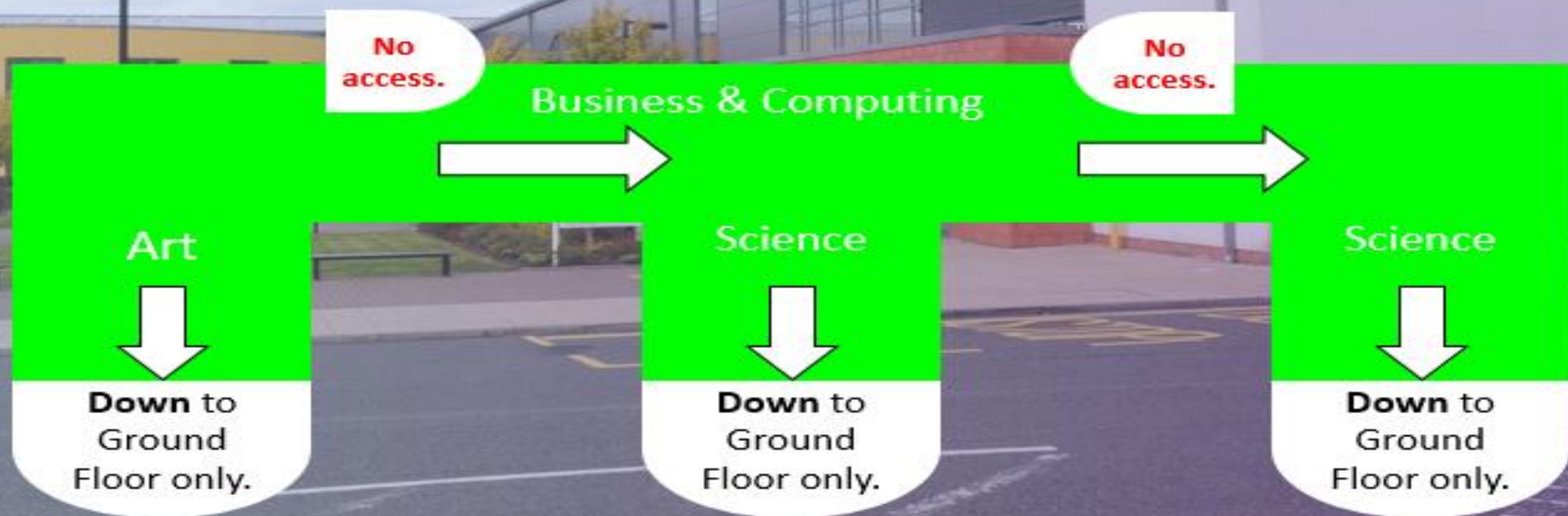
# 1st Floor

- The Maths stairwell is the **only** pupil access to the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor.
- The English stairwell is **only** for pupils going to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor or the Library.



# 2nd Floor

- The Art stairwell is the **only** pupil access to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor.
- The Science stairwell can't be used to access Maths / the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor.

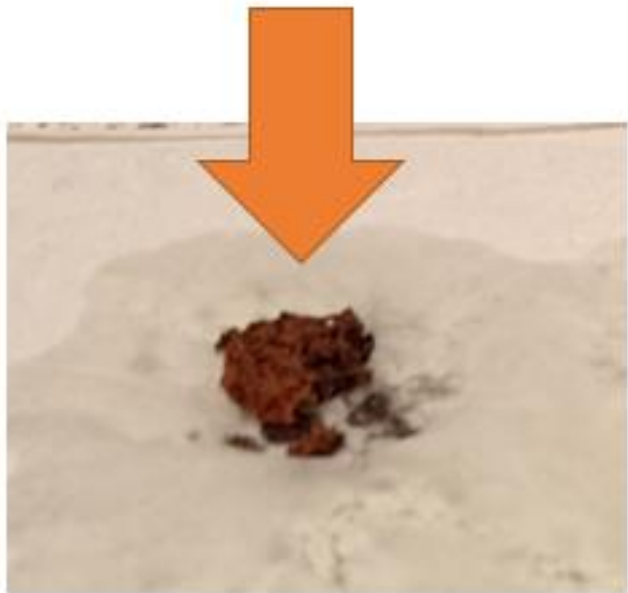


- Speak to Mr. Crosbie in the English department. He will be available in F089 on **Monday, Tuesday** and **Wednesday** before and after school.
