Baby

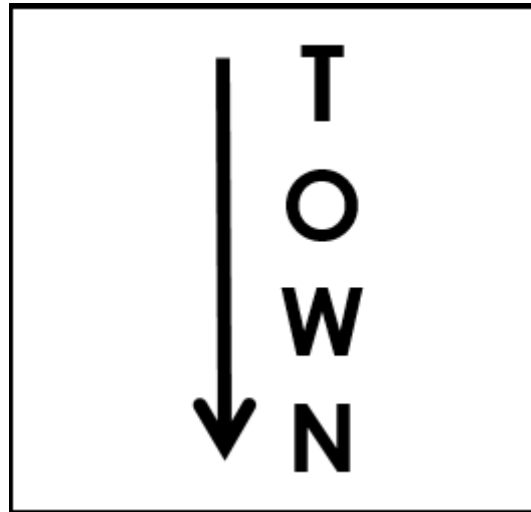
Hold your arms as if holding a baby
