Well done to all the pupils who got through to the second round of the Reader's Cup try-outs.



Our partner school in France received their letters from our S4 pupils this week! They were delighted to have interacted with a Scottish school and we hope to keep the partnership going!


















#### PARASPORT FESTIVAL


