

#### ASSESSMENTS

You will have final practical exams, assignments and submissions for SQA due throughout February and March.

Final exams will be held during late April to early June 2024. The SQA will confirm the exact dates later this year.

## ICT in the Senior Phase


It is crucial that you have access to the various ICT platforms that we use in the school so that you can keep up to date with your coursework, teachers and any year group announcements.

All \$4 pupils will receive 3 workshops this week as part of your PSE programme.






