We are now in the process of appointing \$1 - \$4 House Captains. Pupils can scan the QR code to apply for this role.



### Suzannah Curran


Suzannah (4G2) competed at the North Ayrshire Age Development Meet on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> September.

#### Child Benefit when a pupil reaches age 16

Child Benefit payments stop on 31 August on or after a child's 16th birthday if they leave education or training.

However, it continues if you stay in education/training, but you must tell the Child Benefit Office.

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#### **Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA)**

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) gives financial support to eligible 16-19 year olds who want to continue learning.

EMA is a weekly payment of £30 for students who are planning to continue in post-compulsory education from August 2023.

Payments are made directly into your bank account.

If your date of birth falls between 1 March 2004 and 30 September 2007, you may be eligible for EMA from the start of the academic year 2023/24.

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#### **Young Carers**

A young carer is someone who looks after a person who has physical and/or mental health challenges.

#### **Young Carer Grant**

This is a payment for Young Carers in Scotland aged 16, 17, or 18, who care for people who are in receipt of a qualifying disability benefit.

Young Carer Grant is a yearly payment, currently £359.65

#### Carers Allowance and Carers Allowance Supplement

If you care for someone at least 35 hours a week, who gets a qualifying disability benefit, you could get £76.75 a week.

For those who are receiving Carer's Allowance, there is an automatic extra payment from Social Security Scotland in June and December of £270.50


