

THE SENIOR PHASE – S5/6

There are a wide range of different qualification types available throughout S5/6


- National Qualifications (N5 up to Advanced Higher)
- SCQF Level Awards (L5, L6 and L7)
- NPAs National Progression Awards (internally assessed)
- SfW Skills for Work Courses (internally assessed)

In Grange Academy we offer a 'free choice' model, where pupils select subjects without the restriction of options columns.

In total, pupils in S5 will study **five** subjects plus PSE and Wider Achievement periods. In S6, pupils can study up to and including **five** subjects.

In S5/6 there are no fixed columns – you should pick your five subjects freely from the options available to you.

LABOUR MARKET INTELLIGENCE

4,700 people




Administrative and Support Service:

As we highlighted in our analysis of the mid-term, the operating practices of some industries are changing and evolving and will continue to do so over the longer term too. Automation has accelerated as a result of the pandemic and Industry 4.0 is set to have an even greater impact on the operating practices of industries such as Wholesale and Retail.

AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL (AGD)

The Ayrshire Growth Deal – Scotland's first non-city deal – was signed in November 2020 and will bring a public sector investment of £251.5 million into the region.

The scale of this deal will galvanise efforts to develop key strategic sites and key sectors in Ayrshire and aims to facilitate private sector investment of more than £300m into the region and to support up to 7,000 new jobs.

The vision for the Ayrshire Growth Deal is for Ayrshire to be a vibrant, outward looking, confident region, attractive to investors and visitors, making a major contribution to Scotland's growth and local wellbeing and leading the implementation of digital technologies and the next generation of manufacturing.

Skills are a cross-cutting priority for the region, with a sectoral focus upon:
















EXAMPLE LEARNER PATHWAYS

- A) Some pupils will work towards five Higher courses
- B) Some pupils will take a combination of National 5 and Higher courses
- C) Some pupils will study 4 subjects in school and attend College on a Tuesday/Thursday afternoon as part of the School College Partnership
- D) Some pupils will embark on a Foundation Apprenticeship in addition to their school subjects.
- E) In S6, some pupils will study up to 3 Advanced Highers, additional Highers and then allow time for H Leadership or AH Study periods.



Will I definitely get to study my first-choice subjects?

We always aim to ensure that all pupils get to study their preferred subjects in S5/6. However, sometimes courses do not run because of low uptake or due to timetabling constraints. Unfortunately, we do not have an infinite amount of teaching time available and cannot always guarantee that a course will run.

If a course is oversubscribed, we may also have to look at your intended career path before coming to a decision about whether or not we should allocate a space to you.

MAKING YOUR CHOICES

- Consider your future pathway post school and any entry requirements that may be needed.
- Consider your own skills and talents
- Rely on the support of your family discuss your choices with them
- Do not base choices on the choices of your friends these are your choices
- Use My World of Work and the Options Information Booklet to help inform your choice.

MAKING CHOICES

There are several factors to consider when selecting subjects:

We recommend you prioritise subjects as follows (presuming you have passed N5 courses in S4)

- those subjects listed as entry requirements for the university course(s) of your choice
- those subjects where you are predicted to attain an A or a B pass at National 5 level
- those subjects you are good at
- those subjects you enjoy

Do I need to attain to a particular level at N5 to start a Higher course in S5?

The answer to this question is not always the same for every pupil. However, experience shows that for most pupils, it is necessary to attain to the levels shown below to have a *realistic* chance of progressing at the next level.

PROGRESSION FROM N5 TO HIGHER

What is the advice about requiring an A or a B pass at National 5 based on?

The latest SQA progression statistics (pre COVID) for those moving from a C pass at National 5 to Higher are as follows:

In some subjects, such as Art, Music, PE and History, those with a C pass at N5 have a good chance of passing the Higher course. However, in Maths, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Spanish, French and Design and Manufacture, progression is more of a challenge, whereby pupils with a 'C' at National 5 have less than a 30% chance of progressing to a pass at Higher.

SCHOOL COLLEGE COURSES

- All young people wishing to attend college must complete an online application form in order to secure a place on a programme of study.
- School staff will provide support and guidance in relation to the application process.
- You may be invited for interview and Ayrshire College will decide who is accepted on to each course.
- Should your application be rejected, you will need to select an additional subject to study in school.

If you are interested in applying to a School College course please let your Guidance Teacher know by sending them a message TODAY!

SOME FREQUENT QUESTIONS

Do I need to take ...?

In S5/6, there are no mandatory subjects. However, all pupils require a full timetabled curriculum and will receive PSE plus a Wider Achievement Option

Do we get 'free' periods?

There are no 'free' periods in S5. Pupils in S6 may select an AH Study Pathway if they are studying two or more Advanced Highers. In addition, S6 pupils can undertake Higher Leadership which serves as an excellent way to build up UCAS application forms etc.

Where can I find out about ...?


There are a variety of resources we have created to support this process which are highlighted later in this presentation. Please research as much information about courses and further education requirements.

Can they change their mind?

Yes! We understand that pupils will sometimes make a wrong choice. We will always aim to support a young person to find the right pathway. If, once they have submitted their option form, you would like to make an amendment – please contact the school office in the first instance.

If a request to change subject happens after the start of the course – this might not always be able to be met. We would need to explore whether there is any space in the requested subject and we would need to consider how much of the course has been missed.

S6... THE FINAL YEAR



GRANGE ACADEMY S6

I know that I need to stay on so that I can gain enough qualifications to apply for college, employment or university next year (excluding Advanced Highers which are addressed later in this guide)

If you are starting S6 with a need to increase your portfolio of attainment, we would highly recommend that you study four or five subjects in S6. Our experience shows that when requiring specific qualifications in S6 to secure entry to college or university, you are more likely to attain well if you study as many subjects as possible.

I have accumulated the qualifications I need to secure a college place already

In our experience, if you have decided upon a college pathway and you have already attained what you require to begin your course, you may benefit from moving onto college at the end of S5. College provision can prepare you well for the world of work and open pathways to HNC or HND qualifications that are not possible in school. You should make an appointment with our Careers Adviser as soon as possible.

ADVANCED HIGHERS

How do universities view Advanced Highers?

In Scottish universities Advanced Highers are not usually required for entry, and, generally, it is more important to achieve the Highers required for entry level first before considering Advanced Highers.

For more competitive programmes, for example, medicine, dentistry or veterinary science, students are likely to need five Highers achieved in the fifth year, and then two advanced Highers and an additional Higher in the sixth year sitting.

It is extremely important to always check specific entry requirements and talk directly to the universities if you have any doubts or questions about the Advanced Higher(s) or the combination of Highers and Advanced Highers you are considering in your sixth year. Some universities in England, Wales and Northern Ireland accept Highers for entry to their degree programmes, but many other institutions will, in addition, ask for up to three Advanced Highers.

ADVANCED HIGHERS

Advanced Highers within Grange Academy

In recent years, we have offered Advanced Higher Maths, Biology, Chemistry, English, Music, Drama and Art and have welcomed pupils from across East Ayrshire during class contact time. Advanced Highers are a valued part of our school curriculum. However, on an annual basis we need to review our Advanced Higher provision in light of the legal obligation we have to deliver the BGE (S1-S3 curriculum) and to provide S4-S5 pupils with the chance to sit National 5 and Higher qualifications.
