



### LABOUR MARKET INTELLIGENCE

Job openings are expected to be concentrated in a small number of industries, with four industries in Ayrshire forecast to account for 22,500 (58.1 per cent) of the requirement. These are (see Figure 12):

**4,700 people** 




### Administrative and Support Service:

As we highlighted in our analysis of the mid-term, the operating practices of some industries are changing and evolving and will continue to do so over the longer term too. Automation has accelerated as a result of the pandemic and Industry 4.0 is set to have an even greater impact on the operating practices of industries such as Wholesale and Retail.

# **AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL (AGD)**

The Ayrshire Growth Deal – Scotland's first non-city deal – was signed in November 2020 and will bring a public sector investment of £251.5 million into the region.

The scale of this deal will galvanise efforts to develop key strategic sites and key sectors in Ayrshire and aims to facilitate private sector investment of more than £300m into the region and to support up to 7,000 new jobs.

The vision for the Ayrshire Growth Deal is for Ayrshire to be a vibrant, outward looking, confident region, attractive to investors and visitors, making a major contribution to Scotland's growth and local wellbeing and leading the implementation of digital technologies and the next generation of manufacturing.

### THE SENIOR PHASE – S4

There are a wide range of different qualification types available throughout S4

- National Qualifications (National 3, National 4 and National 5)
- SCQF Level Awards (Level 3, Level 4 and Level 5)
- NPAs National Progression Awards (internally assessed)
- SfW Skills for Work Courses (internally assessed)

In Grange Academy we offer a 'free choice' model, where pupils select subjects without the restriction of options columns.

In total, pupils in S4 will study **seven** subjects plus PSE and Supporting Attainment/Core PE periods. In S5, pupils study five subjects and in S6, pupils can study up to and including **five** subjects.

For pupils involved in the **SFA Performance School** – two columns will be blocked off to enable you to access the requirements of the Performance School. In addition to Maths and English you will study **three** additional subjects.

For **Hearing Impaired** pupils – one column can be allocated for you to work with staff in the Hearing Impairment Department. In addition to Maths and English you could study **four** additional subjects plus time with the HI Department.
















### **EXAMPLE LEARNER PATHWAYS**

- A) Some pupils will complete seven SCQF Level 5 courses (English and Maths plus 5 others)
- B) Some pupils will take a combination of SCQF Level 3, 4 and 5 courses
- C) Some pupils will go study 6 subjects in school and attend College on a Tuesday/Thursday afternoon as part of the School College Partnership
- D) SFA Performance School pupils will study 5 subjects (English and Maths plus 3 others)
- E) Hearing Impaired pupils may choose to study 6 subjects plus have dedicated time with the HI Department.

### **GRANGE ACADEMY S4**

### Will I definitely get to study my first-choice subjects?

We always aim to ensure that all pupils get to study their preferred subjects in S4. However, sometimes courses do not run because of low uptake or due to timetabling constraints. Unfortunately, we do not have an infinite amount of teaching time available and cannot always guarantee that a course will run.

Generally, a course needs at least ten pupils to run. If a course is oversubscribed, we may also have to look at your intended career path before coming to a decision about whether or not we should allocate a space to you.

# **MAKING YOUR CHOICES**

- Consider your own skills and talents
- Rely on the support of your family discuss your choices with them
- Do not base choices on the choices of your friends these are your choices
- Use My World of Work and the Options Information Booklet to help inform your choice.

# **MAKING CHOICES**

There are several factors to consider when selecting subjects:

You should not select a subject that you did not study in S3 (unless it is a subject, such as Health Sector or Travel and Tourism, which is appearing for the first time in S4)

Only in exceptional circumstances should you select to study three subjects within a curricular area (Sciences, Social Subjects etc). At this stage it is important not to narrow your curriculum too much – in these situations we would discuss them on a case by case basis.

# **SCHOOL COLLEGE COURSES**

- All young people wishing to attend college must complete an online application form in order to secure a place on a programme of study.
- School staff will provide support and guidance in relation to the application process.
- You may be invited for interview and Ayrshire College will decide who is accepted on to each course.
- Should your application be rejected, you will need to select an additional subject to study in school.

If you are interested in applying to a School College course please let your Guidance Teacher know by sending them a message TODAY!

# **SOME FREQUENT QUESTIONS**

### Why only take three of the same curricular area in exceptional circumstances?

At this stage, in S4, we are keen that pupils do not narrow their subject choice too much. In Science, for example, very few University level courses state the need for three Sciences as an entry requirement.

### Do I need to take ...?

In S4, the only mandatory qualification subjects are English and Maths. In additional all pupils will receive PSE and Core PE (unless studying PE as a National Qualification).

### Where can I find out about ...?

Please see the next two pages for the variety of resource we have created to support this process.

### Can they change their mind?

Yes! We understand that pupils will sometimes make a wrong choice. We will always aim to support a young person to find the right pathway. If, once they have submitted their option form, you would like to make an amendment – please contact the school office in the first instance.

If a request to change subject happens after the start of the course – this might not always be able to be met. We would need to explore whether there is any space in the requested subject and we would need to consider how much of the course has been missed.
