



Prelims

Good luck to all our senior pupils who are sitting their prelim exams.

Here are some things to remember:

Make sure you arrive at least 10 minutes before the start of the exam, and check your seat number before entering.

You must wear school uniform while attending for prelims.

Phones, smartwatches and other devices

MUST BE SWITCHED

OFF (not just on silent!) and placed inside your bag, or left at home.

When you finish an assessment, you must return to your timetabled class – do not loiter in The Street, the library or other areas of the school.



<u>Prelims</u>

For everyone else, it is important that we help the prelims run as smoothly as possible.

This means keeping noise to a minimum in areas of the school where exams are taking place.

Please also look out for signs which will tell you when a room (e.g. the library) is closed for prelims and you should not enter.

Cyber Camp & STEM Camp

Glasgow Caledonian University is delighted to offer two fully funded residential programmes for pupils in S4 and S5 at their city-centre campus.

GCU Cyber Camp: Tuesday 10th – Thursday 12th June 2025

Aims to develop the pupils' skills and to encourage them to consider studying cyber security and to think about pursuing a career in this field.

Will focus on hands-on activities, including a real-life problem they have to solve. They'll have workshops in general digital skills as well as in digital forensics, ethical hacking and programming and develop other skills including communication.

GCU STEM Camp: Monday 23rd – Wednesday 25th June 2025

Aims to encourage more pupils to consider Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) as a future study and career path whilst developing skills related to these areas.

Will focus on hands-on activities and meta skills development including communication. Pupils will have general skills workshops on bending metal, welding and machining and also programming skills.

School closes at the usual time on Friday 20th December.




Can you remember the sign from the last bulletin?
