GCU Cyber Camp

10 to 12 June 2025 | Closing date: 15 April 2025

Glasgow Caledonian University is delighted to offer a fully funded residential programme at GCU's Cyber Camp from 10 to 12 June for school pupils aged 16 - 18 from S4 and S5 at the University's city-centre campus.

Hosted by the University's Department of Cyber Security and Networks at the School of Computing, Engineering and Built Environment, it aims to develop the pupils' skills and to encourage them to consider studying cyber security and to think about pursuing a career in this field.

The event will focus on hands-on activities and they'll work in teams of three or four and be presented with a real-life problem they have to solve. They'll have workshops in general digital skills as well as in digital forensics, ethical hacking and programming and develop other skills including communication. Pupils will be supervised throughout and will also have evening social activities.

The residential element is central to their experience and all participants are expected to stay within the University accommodation during the programme. They'll stay at the University's on-campus residences in individual rooms with en-suite, sharing a flat of six to eight rooms and will be separated by gender.

The fully funded places for GCU's Cyber Camp are made possible thanks to the School of Computing, Engineering and Built Environment's generous industry prize sponsors. Funding will fully cover tuition costs, accommodation, all meals and organised activities. Please inform us of any dietary requirements when applying.

Note: This camp is not suitable for pupils studying the NPA Cyber Security at Level 5 or 6.

STEM Camp

23 to 25 June 2025

Glasgow Caledonian University is delighted to offer school pupils from S4 - S5, aged 16 - 18 a fully funded residential programme. The programme is hosted by the School of Computing, Engineering and Built Environment and aims to encourage more pupils to consider Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) as a future study and career whilst developing skills related to these areas.

The fully funded places for GCU's STEM Camp are made possible thanks to the School of Computing, Engineering, & Built Environment's generous industry prize sponsors. The programme will focus on hands-on activities and meta skills development including communication. School pupils are divided into teams of 4-5 and presented with a real life problem. Pupils will initially have general skills workshops on bending metal, welding and machining and also programming skills. Pupils will be supervised throughout the programme time and will have social evening activities.

Accommodation will be at the University's halls in individual rooms with en-suite sharing a flat of 6-8 rooms and will be separated by gender. The residential element of the programme is key and all participants are expected to stay within the university accommodation during the programme. Funding will fully cover tuition costs, accommodation, all meals and organised activities. Please inform us of any dietary requirements when applying.

What Is Space School?

- This years Space School programme will take place at Strathclyde University from Monday 9 Friday 13 June 2025.
- This is a non-residential week. Pupils should be able to make their own way there each day, to Strathclyde University Campus and take part in a series of workshops from 9am-5pm.
- The programme will provide attendees with an opportunity to take part in an eclectic mix of space-themed lectures, labs and workshops and to learn from some of the world's leading figures in space travel, including NASA astronauts and engineers.
- There are only 100 spaces available.








