Word Choice Questions - Formula

- 1. Quote the most important word(s)
- Analyse the word(s) in detail the connotation, associations the word has, sound or tone etc.
- 3. Discuss the effect of the word.
- Explain how the word helps you to understand the writer or speaker's ideas/opinions.

You should assume that you are aiming to achieve five ticks per use of word choice formula:

- 1. Quoting specific word(s)
- 2. "...has connotations of..."
- 3. Accurate explanation of connotations
- 4. Accurate explanation of effect of word
- 5. Accurate explanation of how the word helps you understand the writer or speaker's opinion

This is where you link your response back to the question/task. It will be easier to complete the word choice formula if you first identify the key words of the question/task.

Connotation & Denotation

- Denotation refers to the literal meaning of a word or the "dictionary definition." For example, if you look up the word snake in a dictionary, you will discover that one of its denotative meanings is "any of numerous scaly, legless, sometimes venomous reptiles having a long, tapering, cylindrical body and found in most tropical and temperate regions."
- Connotation, on the other hand, refers to the associations that are connected to a certain word or the emotional suggestions related to that word. The connotative meanings of a word exist together with the denotative meanings. The connotations for the word snake could include evil or danger.
