Literacy

Reading and Spelling

This term we will be using the novel "There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom" by Louis Sachar. We will practise our reading skills through this novel study including visualisation, characterisation, prediction and summarising.

We will continue to use Active Literacy approaches to improve spelling and learn a variety of spelling rules to improve and extend our knowledge and skills when writing independently.

<u>Writing</u>

Ligardy

This term we will focus on non chronological reports, explanations, instructions, and procedural writing. Writing is taught once per week but we write daily in class for a variety of interdisciplinary learning.

Listening & Talking

This term we will have the opportunity to deliver a solo talk to the class and then, as a class, discuss the topic that has been delivered. We will prepare our solo talks at home as a homework task. The homework will be set for the whole month of May and then delivered in class at the end of May. The solo talk can be a slide presentation or a written talk read to the class.

Numeracy and Maths



We will continue to develop our numeracy skills through Number Talks revising and learning new strategies to support addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations. Our focus for numeracy is : 2 step function machines, information handling, volume and money. Pupils will be given opportunities to revise and consolidate prior learning and challenge and extend their skills and knowledge. Mrs Conetta will be focusing on maths and in particular, coordinates and symmetry.

All pupils have personal targets for literacy/numeracy that can be viewed on their e-portfolios. These targets are regularly reviewed and evidence uploaded.
