Playroom News



We have had a busy few weeks in both rooms. The children in the Rainbow room have been developing their independence skills when preparing to go outside by putting on their own jackets and boots. With the change in the weather, the children have also been exploring the weather through science experiments to support their curiosity and fine motor skills.

Children in the Butterfly room, area 1 have been exploring different textures and sensory experiences including making dancing popcorn, making an ink rainbow and mixing colours. Within area 2, the children have had the opportunity to explore existing experiences within the home corner, where they have made baby food by blending vegetables into puree and tasting the baby food they have made. They have also been exploring numeracy and expressive arts through their interests in dinosaurs.



During the month, our leadership groups have started to take ideas forward from the Centre's improvement plan. Work has started on developing plans to develop understanding around Children's Rights through the Rights Respecting Schools initiative. The Eco-committee have held their first meeting and have plans to support the Centre to reduce, recycle and reuse waste to support a Greener Planet. Rights Respecting Schools






Meet Mr. Windy!
