#### **Playroom News**



During October, the children in the Rainbow room have started regular visits to the large outdoor space, enjoyed parent stay and play sessions and taken part in parent/child bookbug sessions. The children have been focusing on taking turns, independence skills in getting ready for outside and understanding how to keep themselves safe.

Children in the Butterfly room, continue to have opportunities to visit the outdoor areas in both the courtyard and larger garden area daily. Children have explored a variety of sensory experiences as part of Halloween and have focused on rules to keep themselves safe. Children in all areas have also been exploring number recognition through songs, rhyme and games.



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

All pre-school children will have the opportunity to visit the woods with parents/carers being notified ahead of their child's planned 4 week programme.

## Powerdown Challenge!



Childsmile will be in the Centre to apply the fluoride varnish on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November for children with consenting parents.
