

LABOUR MARKET INTELLIGENCE

Job openings are expected to be concentrated in a small number of industries, with four industries in Ayrshire forecast to account for 22,500 (58.1 per cent) of the requirement. These are (see Figure 12):



Wholesale and Retail Trade:

7,600 people



Human Health and Social Work:

6,800 people



Accommodation and Food Service:

4,700 people




Administrative and Support Service:

3,500 people

As we highlighted in our analysis of the mid-term, the operating practices of some industries are changing and evolving and will continue to do so over the longer term too. Automation has accelerated as a result of the pandemic and Industry 4.0 is set to have an even greater impact on the operating practices of industries such as Wholesale and Retail

AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL (AGD)

The Ayrshire Growth Deal – Scotland's first non-city deal – was signed in November 2020 and will bring a public sector investment of £251.5 million into the region.

The scale of this deal will galvanise efforts to develop key strategic sites and key sectors in Ayrshire and aims to facilitate private sector investment of more than £300m into the region and to support up to 7,000 new jobs.

The vision for the Ayrshire Growth Deal is for Ayrshire to be a vibrant, outward looking, confident region, attractive to investors and visitors, making a major contribution to Scotland's growth and local wellbeing and leading the implementation of digital technologies and the next generation of manufacturing.

Skills are a cross-cutting priority for the region, with a sectoral focus upon:

- Aerospace/space sector;
- Clean growth;
- Food and drink;
- · Visitor economy; and
- Digital.

Do I need to take ...?

In S3, you are still part of the Broad General Education. This means that you are entitled to experience a curriculum that covers all the Curricular Areas. In additional all pupils will receive PSE and PE.

Where can I find out about ...?

Can they change their mind?

Yes! We understand that pupils will sometimes make a wrong choice. We will always aim to support a young person to find the right pathway. If, once they have submitted their option form, you would like to make an amendment – please contact the school office in the first instance.

If a request to change subject happens after the start of the course – this might not always be able to be met. We would need to explore whether there is any space in the requested subject and we would need to consider how much of the course has been missed.
