All S3 pupils involved in Bronze DofE should attend a meeting in PE at 1.30 today.

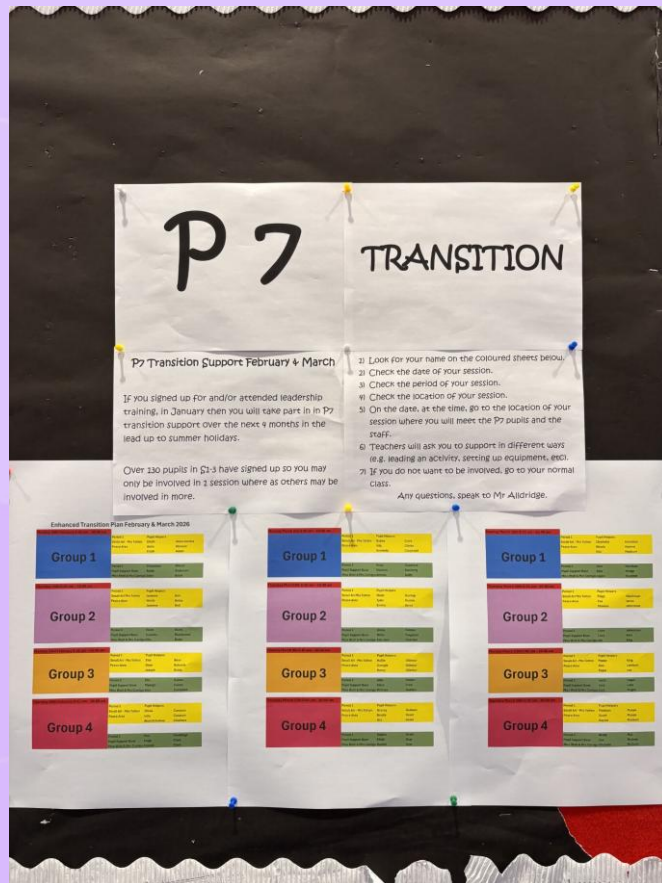


S6 Gold DofE:

Access to Nautical & STEM Course



S4 – 6

The UK maritime sector is one of the most pivotal industries to the UK and covers shipping of goods, port services, and offshore industries like oil & gas. Careers within the Merchant Navy are typically divided into three specialisms:

- **Deck** (navigation and ship operations)
- **Marine Engineering** (onboard mechanical and technical systems)
- **Electro-technical** (electrical and electronic systems onboard)

Students study key subjects such as Maths, Physics, and Engineering Science, while also developing teamwork, communication, and employability skills.

On completion of the course, students can progress to a fully sponsored HNC or HND Merchant Navy cadetship. These three-year programmes combine college learning with real life experience during placements at sea.

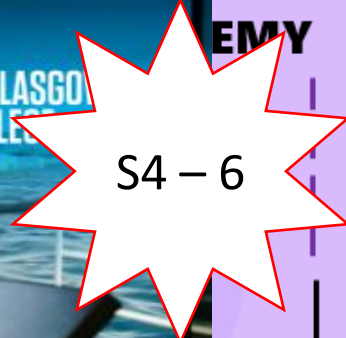
