Raising Attainment, particularly in Literacy and Numeracy- we will continue to:


- Improve outcomes for children, through regular GIRFEC meetings between class teachers and the HT/DHT.

- Share strategies and approaches with Parents and Carers to support learning at home e.g. parent/child activities.




Ensuring the health and wellbeing of all young people—— we will continue to:
