

Parent Pay

Parent Pay allows us to be a "cashless" school and is also an important method of communication between school and home. Many letters, updates and public health information will be shared via this forum.

A letter to activate your child's account has been sent home, please activate this as soon as possible to ensure you don't miss any important information.

We have noticed that some new P1 accounts are showing a negative balance but please be assured that the parent pay team are working on this discrepancy and any incorrect charges will be amended electronically.



Warn & Inform

Children and education staff will no longer be automatically asked to self-isolate if there is a positive COVID-19 case identified within a school or nursery.

All **significant** close contacts (generally household or sleepover) of any cases will be identified by Test and Protect and advised to follow the latest guidance regarding self-isolation and testing.

Pupils that are not significant close contacts but are, for example, in a class with someone that has tested positive, will receive a "Warn & Inform" letter from the school which shares important information regarding symptoms to look out for and next steps if your child demonstrates any COVID symptoms.

Annual Data Check

Please complete these forms and return if you have not already done so. We ask that you ensure that all contact details are up to date and please amend any changes then sign the bottom of both sides of the form.

It is essential that we have the correct emergency contact information for every child as early as we can in the session.

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Photo Consent

A link has been sent via our school app, please ensure that this is completed for your child if you have not already done so. This will allow class teachers to share your child's learning experiences on our school GLOW Blog for you to see from home.

School Lunches

School dinners are still being served within classrooms in conjunction with the mitigations in place for both the school and catering staff. EAC have now gone plastic free with their milk supplier and milk is now served in paper cups. Bottled water is still being provided for those that request water with their lunch.

Menus for the rolling 3 weekly rotation of school meals are available on the school app daily.



Homework

I know that many of you are desperate to get started with homework this session. We are only distributing Reading homework or encouraging Reading for Enjoyment (either independently or with a family member) up until the September Holiday.

The reason for this is that staff have been collating the very varied responses to homework from our Evaluation of Service questionnaire in regards to homework.

We have a working group that are designing the revised format for homework that will run in blocks beginning 21st September through to 3rd December for Block 1. This will be shared with pupils, parents/carers both in paper format and digitally as soon as it is complete.

Breakfast Club

We continue to have enquiries about when Breakfast Club will reopen. At the moment, when we and the associated ECC's are still using staggered entry and exit times, this will not be possible.

We do hope to get this valuable service back up and running as soon as we can this session. I will share information as soon as I have any.

Social Distancing & Face Coverings

We have returned to school with all of the same mitigations in place as we had before the Summer Holiday. All schools are adhering to this structure and we will keep you updated of any changes as and when they come.



Scottish Government guidance on 'COVID- reducing the risks in schools', states:

*if parents/carers are dropping off/collecting children, they should wear face coverings to all school sites (including outside).

*if parents/carers are dropping off/collecting children, they should be discouraged from gathering outside the school and should maintain distancing (1m) as far as practicable, when dropping off/collecting their children.

Fàilte mhòr chridheil gu Clas 1 agus fàilte air ais gu Clas 2-7.


A huge warm welcome to Clas 1 and welcome back to Clas 2-7.
