Sgoil-àraich na Coille Nuaidh Update

It has been a busy March and April. The children were learning about Ramadan and Eid before the spring break. The children enjoyed exploring the bright costumes and music associated with these festivals.

Some children have been part of our transition programme to Whitehirst Park. They have been enjoying this opportunity. Our SnCN transition has also started and will continue this term.

Since the spring break the children have been interested in exploring different foods and have been tasting 'fancy fruits'. Strider also came for a visit to help encourage our children and young people to be active, and they have all had mini-stride home for an adventure.

SNCN and JHP update

Our Cash for Kids fundraising took a huge part of our focus in March as the whole school community worked together to try to reach or target total of £1500. We absolutely smashed this amount raising £12,015.19. The money was initially planned to be split 3 ways between the Haven, new sports equipment and additional afterschool clubs. The 'spend' in each area has now been extended and we have sought pupil view for the rest of the spend.

The wall panels are finally up. A huge thanks to Donna Leitch at EAC for pushing this to be completed during the spring break. We now need to complete a Risk Assessment for safe panel use and they will be ready to be used.

Congratulations to the P6 and P7's who attended the recent Scottish Handball competition. Although they didn't place in the top 3, they did exceptionally well and we plan to include this context within our PE curriculum next year.

- £978 Iron on badges stock replenishment...still have 531 JHPS, 107 SNCN & 65 Nursery. To date we've sold 590 badges (£1475.50). Original cost was £1938, so still need to sell £462.50 to break even (185 badges). 703 badges still to sell (£1757.50) therefore profit once all sold will be £1295. Debbie to liaise with company but propose order 500 JHPS & 100 SnCN prior to April. Needs Fundraising approval c £978 (inc VAT)

FUNDRAISING APPLICATIONS UPDATE:

Dobbies – succeeded in winning the Helping Your Community Grow application! Well done Debbie for the application. Confirmed on 5th May and the Ayr store will support the school with gardening products/plants to make green spaces a little brighter. We have a specific budget available to us as the prize and need to arrange a visit with the Community Champion in the shop to go and purchase everything we need (at cost price so a good saving). The project was to rejuvenate the Community Garden by the Sports Centre. Ms Dougan has also engaged Kilmarnock Academy and Ms Gorry will be our lead contact. OCTOBER UPDATE: - Store has now made contact and a visit to be agreed. NOV Update – handed over to school and Miss Gorry is leading. She is looking to organize a date with the Gardening Gang to visit Dobbies and select equipment.
