Uniform and Badge

Pupils from both James Hamilton and Kilmarnock Academies were involved in designing the new uniform and badge. The new school tie is a blend of both school colours, retaining the history of both schools in a new and exciting design.

The uniform will consist of:

- White shirt and tie
- Black trousers or skirt
- Black jumper or cardigan
- Black shoes

The school badge was also designed in consultation with pupils.

The badge represents both schools:

- ♦ <u>Torch</u> means to illuminate, just as education does.
- ♦ Infinity sign means there are no limits to what we can achieve
- ♦ Curling stone represents New Farm Loch, the location of the school
- ◆ Dean Castle is the centre of the catchment area

The school motto is "**Aspire Together, Achieve Together**" highlighting the joining of two schools and the aim of working cooperatively.

Topping Out Ceremony

In October, around 80 guests attended the Topping Out Ceremony at the new school. Visitors from East Ayrshire Council, Kier Construction, James Hamilton Academy, Kilmarnock Academy and associated Primary Schools enjoyed a tour of the school. Values

A few weeks later, staff from both Secondary Schools attended workshops followed by around one hundred pupils from SI-6. Every session was led by Derek Gall from CANI Coaching.
