











Homework grid

<p><u>Literacy - LCWC</u> Look at the word, say it out loud, cover the word up, write it down and check to see if you have spelled your word correctly.</p> 	<p><u>Literacy - Stick Writing</u> Go out in the garden or on a walk and collect sticks. Can you write your sounds and common words using them.</p> 	<p><u>Literacy - Magazine Writing</u> Find old magazines or newspapers and cut up letters to make your common words or words with your sounds in them</p> 	<p><u>Literacy - Front Cover</u> Create a new front cover for your reading book or your favourite book. Remember all the things we need on a front cover. Title, pictures, author and illustrator.</p> 
<p><u>Literacy - Word Lists</u> Make a word list. Can you think of words that have your sounds in them and can you write down a list of them?</p> 	<p><u>Literacy - Digital Learning</u> Read your books on Giglets and complete the activities. Try and do this every week.</p> 	<p><u>Numeracy - Board Game</u> Make a board game where the questions are addition calculations. Examples are snakes and ladders, Monopoly or bingo.</p> 	<p><u>Numeracy - Addition Drawings</u> Show an addition calculation by drawing a picture to show it. An example could be - 3 dogs and 3 cats in a garden. How many animals altogether?</p>
