Language & Literacy

We will be reading the novel 'Kensuke's Kingdom by .

Michael Morpurgo Learners will be supported to develop their use of the six Active Reading strategies - metalinguistics, inference, summarising, prior knowledge, main ideas and visualisation. In writing we will learn to takes notes from film clips and then write reports using the correct format. Spelling and Handwriting will continue too.

Health & Wellbeing

<u>P.E.</u> – The children will be learning Scottish Country Dancing this term and also team games, with a focus on Hockey, Badminton and Tennis where they will take turns, share resources and recognise the need to follow rules within the game.

<u>Health</u> – Through the use of the 'PATHS', pupils will explore and develop their understanding of their own feelings and the feelings of others, develop resilience and discuss problem solving strategies. They will be able to discuss and identify good and bad relationships

Numeracy & Mathematics

Interdisciplinary Learning

This term the majority of our contexts for learning will be based on our novel and we will enjoy the study of Japan, where we will look at the environment of Japan and how it compares to ours. Mapping skills will be used to locate key features and we will compare their lifestyle and cultures to our own. We will use this context to produce Art where we will focus on tone and shading for to take inspiration from some of the great Japanese Arists.
