Language & Literacy

We will continue learning 1 new phoneme each week with 3 common words. We now have lots of sounds which help us to blend and write many different words.



Reading books will continue to be given out each week and comprehension tasks are completed in class.

We will continue learning how to write complete sentences with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops through many different writing activities. We will begin adding some connective words to extend our sentences.

Numeracy & Mathematics

- We will be introducing time. We will focus on telling the time to the o'clock as well as linking time to key parts of our daily routines.
- Measurement will be explored by considering height and volume. We will be comparing objects and using mathematical terms to describe the differences.
- We will be using directional language to describe movements. The children will challenge themselves to follow a sequence of instructions that involves turning left and right.

Health & Wellbeing

PE- A block of hockey skills will be completed before we focus on athletics. This will see us learning how to run, jump and throw in preparation for our sports day.

Health - We will continue to use Barnardo's PATHS programme of work to support pupils to explore and develop their understanding of regulating their emotions.

This term we will complete our sexual health talk in line with the East Ayrshire Early Level guidance.



Contexts for Learning

Our context for learning this term will be Dionsaurs. We will be researching to create fact files as well as incubating our own dinosaur eggs. We will be using our context for learning to support imaginative play and story writing.
