Learning Outcome Pupils will be able to identify two or more key features of the work of a specific artist.	<ul> <li>Print of a Pollock action painting example.</li> <li>Outdoor space</li> <li>Large sheets of paper (1m of wallpaper lining paper)1 per pupil</li> <li>Paint (very fluid)</li> <li>Brushes, sticks</li> <li>Pencil and Post-Its</li> </ul>
<ul> <li><u>Activity</u> Paint like Jackson Pollock - Action Painting <ol> <li>Pupils are shown an example of Pollock's work and asked to respond <ul> <li>what do you see, how does it make you feel, would you like to see it on a wall in your own home?</li> </ul> </li> <li>Pupils are asked, 'Is this a painting?'</li> <li>Pupils make their own 'action painting' – first painting an overall background colour then dripping, splatting, flinging paint on to their paper.</li> <li>On completion, pupils report how making the picture made them feel, how looking at the picture makes them feel.</li> <li>Pupils feedback to classmates on what they liked about their work and what ideas/techniques they might borrow for their next piece of action painting.</li> <li>Pupils are asked, 'In a few words and without showing a picture, how would you describe a Jackson Pollock action painting to a friend?' <ul> <li>Pupils write their responses on Post-Its, one Post-It for each response.</li> </ul> </li> </ol></li></ul>	Assessment Teacher assessment of Post-It responses.
