Core Lesson

To recall a story in the correct order. Use of scissors and fine motor control.

Resources needed

Blank journey sheet for each pupil.

Place cards for each part of the journey for each child, cut up in unable to cut themselves.

Additional resources needed

Glue sticks

Lesson Introduction

Show the children the book. Discuss the cover, the illustrations and the words. Tell them the author's name and what an author is. Ask them to tell you what they think the story is going to be about.

Lesson Activity

Read the children the story. Stop and ask questions as you go through the book.

Give each child a map and the pieces to go on it, they can cut these up and stick them up in the write order. Can they recall the order of events? Can they draw over the line with a pencil?














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Core Lesson

Creating a cave as a stimulus for writing.

Resources needed

Den building kit – tarpaulins and ropes

Book

Lesson

Take the children to the green space. This should ideally be in an area with trees. You will sit them on the tarpaulins and read them the story.

Talk about how the bear lived in a cave, it was a shelter, the bear lives outside all of the time. Talk about the houses that they live in, these are shelters too. Give them the tarpaulins and they can try and build a shelter just like the bear cave. (Knots and lashings guidance sheets in folder) It mustn't let in the wind or rain and should be big enough for a group of children to fit in. Take pictures of the process as well as the finished shelter.

On returning to school discussion. This co

ask the children to recall their shelter building process. Use the photos to prompt e written up as either a story or a set of instructions.
