Primary 1 - Have a go board! – December 2025

In Primary 1, we encourage the children to have a go! Below are activities which your child could have a go, when at home this month.

Literacy

These are the phonemes we will be working on this month. Have a go at practising them at home.





qu

Make a duck's beak with your hands and say qu, qu, qu.





Pretend to take an x-ray with an x-ray camera, saying ks, ks, ks.

As part of the Active Literacy program there are periods where we take time to reinforce and consolidate the phonemes previously taught. Please take time over this month to reinforce all the letters. Thank you.

Numeracy

We have been learning to count in 2s up to 30. Challenge your child to have a go! I spy - 3D shape. Have a go at playing I spy around your house or outdoors with 3D shapes.

Have a go with the 3D shape homework included with this grid.



Counting up to and back from 30. Challenge your child to get counting!

Harmony

Discuss the seasons. Can your child draw a picture of their favourite season? Can they explain why it is their favourite?

Phonics

Playdough spelling – encourage your child to spell 2 or 3 letter words with playdough. Remember to get them to read the word by sounding out, blending then making it.

Here are the common words we are learning.

Please practise these at home to help your child with their reading. Please reinforce the previous phonemes taught. Many thanks.
