

## Primary 1 - Have a go board! – February 2026

In Primary 1, we encourage the children to have a go! Below are activities which your child could have a go, when at home this month.

### Literacy

These are the phonemes we will be working on this month. Have a go at practising them at home. 😊

We will be consolidating the phonemes already taught for the first 2 weeks.

Then we are starting digraphs where 2 letters go together to make one sound.



sh

Place index finger over lips and say *sh sh sh*.



th

Pretend to be naughty clowns and stick out tongue a little for *th*.

### Harmony

At home, could you discuss with your child who helps them at home, in the school and in our community. We will be having visitors into our class to reinforce people who help us e.g. police, fire fighters, Vet.

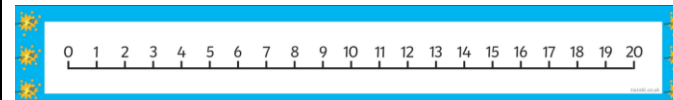
### Numeracy

In Class we are continuing with addition then moving onto subtraction.

We are focussing on doubles within addition. Please see the doubles game.

Addition & subtraction games were given with last month's homework grid.

Previously, your child came home with a number line. We have been adding on a number line in class e.g.  $4 + 2 =$



Start on 4 and do 2 jumps up. Circle the answer - 6.

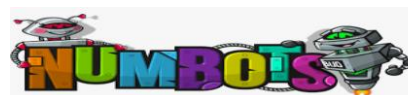
