The earliest known recording of a waffle recipe is in an anonymous manuscript called <i>Le Ménagier de Paris</i>, which was a set of instructions written by a Frenchman for his young wife. In it, the writer describes his own waffle recipe and even mentions an "iron", leading historians to believe waffle irons were invented in the 13th-14th century.</p> <p>*Waffles inspired the soles of Nike's first pair of shoes. Bill Bowerman was watching his wife use their waffle iron one morning in 1971 when he was suddenly struck by the honeycomb shape of the waffle. He knew it would make a perfect sneaker sole.</p> <p>*There are three main types of breakfast waffles:</p> <p><u>Belgian</u>: Also known as a Brussels waffle, it's light and crispy but with deep ridges and leavened with yeast.</p> <p><u>American</u>: A waffle that's been leavened with baking powder instead of yeast.</p> <p><u>Liege</u>: Also invented in Belgium, the Liege is softer, denser and, due to a caramelized sugar coating, sweeter.</p> <p>What other things can you find out?</p> |
