<p>2.45- 3.00</p>	<p><b>SOFT FINISH</b> -  There was a young fellow named Lear  Who invented Limericks, we hear,  so now we converse  in humorous verse  on <b>Limerick Day</b> every year</p> <p>Each year on May 12th, Limerick Day celebrates the birthday of famous English artist, illustrator, and much-loved author and poet, Edward Lear. This artist was born on May 12th 1812 and lived until January 29th 1888.</p> <p>Limericks were named after the Irish city of Limerick, and although limericks were not in fact created by Edward Lear, it was he who popularised them. Limericks could potentially date back as far as 500 years, however it is currently unknown when the very first limerick was created, and whether it was created purposely or by a happy accident.
