Did you know? Many believe the use of paper airplanes originated 2,000 years ago in China. The earliest known date of the creation of modern paper planes was said to have been 1909. The largest paper aircraft had a wingspan of 59.74 ft. Students and employees from Germany created it on 28th September 2013. Joe Ayooob recorded the longest distance flown by a paper airplane in February 2012. His plane flew 226 feet, 10 inches. The longest-lasting paper airplane flight flew 29.2 seconds.
