We can help them by planting more flowers.</p> <p><b>BUTTERFLY FACTS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*There are more than 20,000 types of butterflies worldwide.</li> <li>*Their wingspans can range from 1/2 inch to 11 inches.</li> <li>*Butterflies in their adult stage can live from a week to nearly a year, depending on the species.</li> <li>*Many butterflies migrate over long distances. Particularly famous migrations are those of the Monarch butterfly from Mexico to the northern USA and southern Canada, a distance of about 2500 to 3000 miles.</li> </ul> <p>Try and find the answer to these questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
